## Score Data Summary for 2014 GEPT

## I. Overview

In 2014, an analysis of each level of the General English Proficiency Test (GEPT) showed that $55 \%$ of the total test taking population took the First Stage (Listening and Reading Tests) of the Elementary Level; 35\% took the Intermediate Level; and 10\% took the High-Intermediate or Advanced Level (see Figure 1). As for the Second Stage (Speaking and Writing Tests), 58\% took the Elementary Level; 34\% took the Intermediate Level; and $8 \%$ took the High-Intermediate or Advanced Level (see Figure 2).

An analysis of examinee background shows that the average age of the examinees
was 16.5 , with the oldest being 79 years of age, and $58 \%$ of the examinees being between 15 and 19 years of age (see Table 1). Of all examinees, $50 \%$ had graduated from junior high school; $37 \%$ from senior high school; and $13 \%$ from college or above (see Table 2). Of these, $39 \%$ came from the northern region; $31 \%$ from the central region; $25 \%$ from the southern region; and $5 \%$ came from the eastern region, outlying islands or China (see Table 3). Furthermore, $43 \%$ of all examinees were male, and $57 \%$ were female (see Table 4).

## II. Summary by level

At the Elementary Level, the average age of examinees was 15.1 , with the oldest being 78 years of age. Junior high school students and graduates made up the largest group of examinees ( $74 \%$ ), and vocational high school students and graduates were the second largest group ( $12 \%$ ). The average scores for the First Stage were 82.15 for the Listening Test and 78.94 for the Reading Test, with a passing rate of $50 \%$. The average band scores for the Second Stage were 3.7 for both the Writing Test and the Speaking Test, with a passing rate of $53 \%$. The oldest passing examinee was 71 years of age.

At the Intermediate Level, the average age of examinees was 17.6 , with the oldest being 64 years of age. Senior high school students and graduates made up the largest group of examinees (49\%), and junior high school students and graduates were the second largest group (23\%). The average scores for the First Stage were 81.04 for the Listening Test and 76.48 for the Reading Test, with a passing rate of $43 \%$. The average band scores for the Second Stage were 3.5 for the Writing Test and 3.6 for the Speaking Test, with a passing rate of $32 \%$. The oldest passing examinee was 59 years of age.

At the High-Intermediate Level, the average age of examinees was 20.6, with the oldest being 79 years of age. Senior high school students and graduates made up the largest group of examinees ( $47 \%$ ), and local university students and graduates were the second largest group (33\%). The average scores for the First Stage were 78.54 for the Listening Test and 78.88 for the Reading Test, with a passing rate of $46 \%$. The average band scores for the Second Stage were 3.5 for both the Writing Test and the Speaking Test, with a passing rate of $31 \%$. The oldest passing examinee was 59 years of age.

At the Advanced Level, the average age of examinees was 24.8 while the oldest examinee was 67 years of age. The largest group of examinees ( $60 \%$ ) was made up of
local university students and graduates; overseas university students and graduates; and students who were attending or had completed graduate school either locally or overseas. Senior high school students and graduates were the second largest group (28\%). The average scores for the First Stage were 73.35 for the Listening Test and 65.50 for the Reading Test, with a passing rate of $39 \%$. The average band scores for the Second Stage were 2.2 for the Writing Test and 2.7 for the Speaking Test, with a passing rate of $17 \%$. The oldest passing examinee was 41 years of age.
